The meeting was called to order by President Lynn Tuttle at 10:00 a.m.

Dolores Burton introduced Hyla Crane, Executive Director of the Marco Island Center for the Arts, with a brief biography. Through lecture and pictures, Ms. Crane presented a retrospective of 50 years of art through the lens of Marco Island's efforts and participation. The coffee table book "Marco Made by Hands: Celebrating 50 Years of Marco Island Center for the Arts" is available in the Gallery and on the Website.

On behalf of the Marco Branch of AAUW, Lynn and Dolores expressed appreciation to Hyla Crane for her efforts in sharing the amazing history of the Marco Island Center for the Arts.

A brief business meeting ensued.

The minutes of the November 9, 2020, AAUW Monthly Meeting were amended to reflect the fact that the Great Books Discussion Group meeting dates have been changed to the 1^{st} Thursday of the month at 3:00 p.m. and the 3^{rd} Thursday of the month at 11:00 a.m. The minutes were approved as amended.


