

# **AAUW-Marco Island Information on Scholarships**

We give scholarships to traditional and non-traditional students.

The applications for high school scholars are available to students in both private and public schools in the area through their guidance counselors. Our high school scholarship is for at least \$1000.

Applications for the Martha Yates Scholarship (MY Scholarship) are available today as an attachment to members to take to any woman who is 21 or older and enrolled in an accredited college or university program. Our MY Scholarships are usually for \$1000 but vary with the number of qualifying applicants and the donations of our supporters. Those applying have until March 31 to get their application to Lynn Tuttle, 1490 Caxambas Court, Marco Island, Florida 34145.

The committee meets on April 7 to choose recipients to present to the AAUW-Marco Island board for approval on April 11. The winners are announced at our final meeting of the season, April 18 at Bistro Soleil.

Missy Saracino, Executive Director, presented an overview of the mission, history and programs of the Naples Therapeutic Riding Center. On behalf of the Marco Branch of AAUW, Lynn expressed appreciation for the interesting and informative program.

A brief business meeting ensued.

Lynn thanked Director for Programs Colleen Moser for her efforts in arranging for today's program.

With reference to the National AAUW Virtual Meeting she attended, Lynn noted the Marco Branch might encourage the Martha Yates Scholarship winner(s) to apply for an available National Scholarship. She also reminded the membership of the training sessions for AAUW Lobby Day which will take place February 18 - 21, 2022. The National Conference of College Women Student Leaders will be held virtually this year and the Marco Branch will plan to sponsor one girl. It was noted that National AAUW is amending the By-Laws and is also soliciting employees.

Our lawmakers are in their 60-day legislative session that began on January 11<sup>th</sup>. Please make a difference for Florida's women by contacting you state legislators to support the following bills.

- SB 322/HB 293 Fair Pay Act Fighting for fair pay for all, to provide paycheck and workplace protections not currently ensured in Florida
- SB 388/HB 221 Establishing Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion to ensure diversity in State government programs and activities
- SB 760/HB 521 Increasing criminal penalties for engaging in human trafficking in Florida
