Program Marco Island Charter Middle School Choir

In 1998 Marco Island Charter Middle School (MICMS) opened its doors to welcome 200 students to 14 portable classrooms and a future that hinged on a three-year contract. It has grown and flourished. Achieving academic excellence from the start, the school now occupies a state-of-the-art facility capable of accommodating more than 400 students.

In explaining the school's music program, Principal Michele Wheeler described how entering 6th graders are asked to choose between either choir or band. Should the experience stoke their interest there are several additional levels of participation available.

The school is fortunate to have a very dynamic and community-oriented choir and band director in Martie Miller. Ms. Miller arranges to have her music students participate in both the Marco Island Tree Lighting and Christmas Parade each year. It is quite possible that the MICMS is the only middle school in Collier County to have a marching band! We are fortunate to celebrate the holidays this year with the School's choir.




Great Books Discussion Group

The November AAUW-Marco Meeting hosted Collier County's Dana Alger, Recycling Coordinator. Dana arrived with shopping bags of examples and some new and surprising information.



Did you know that those little triangles surrounding numbers 1-7 on plastic items are not what we should be looking for? Dana advises sorting plastics by shape: If it's a *Bottle, Jar, Jug or Tub*, chances are it is recyclable.

Did you know that recycling protocols can vary not only from State to State but also from County to County? That you can gather and segregate your used Styrofoam for collection at Publix; That cereal boxes can be recycled but not the crinkly inserts. These are only some of



the nuggets Dana shared.

Dana's upbeat and entertaining presentation about this important topic generated lots of questions and comments. Following her talk, Dana distributed reusable grocery bags.
