

National AAUW has updated the process of paying dues. If you have been a member for at least one year, your dues notification will come from National AAUW. Our dues have always been due by June 30th of every year, but since our season was over in April, many women didn't pay dues until they returned in the fall. This year National would like everyone to pay on time. They will send each member a renewal notice. Online payment is the preferred method of payment but they will offer a way to send a check to your local Branch at PO Box 841, Marco Island 34146. Please pay on time.

I found online payment easy. Go to AAUW Login and use your email address and personal password to sign into your Personal Snapshot. Go to the bottom and press RENEW. It takes you to Membership Management. Update your personal information. Follow directions to Membership Type and select National. Next please select add Branch, our branch is FL3054. I am a dual member and was able to select two branches. Next takes you to payment and it will show your total payment due (National, State, and Local) and ask for credit card information. National will notify our Director of Finance, Durell Buzzini that you have renewed for the next year.



Great Books Discussion Group



Thomas McGuane began contributing fiction to *The New Yorker* in 1994. He has written ten novels, including the National Book Award-nominated "<u>Ninety-Two in the Shade</u>," as well as six nonfiction essay collections and two short-story collections. His work has won numerous awards, including the Rosenthal Award of the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters, and has been anthologized in the "Best American Stories," "Best American Essays," and "Best American Sporting Essays." His latest book is "<u>Cloudbursts: Collected and New Stories.</u>"
