A retired U.S. Army colonel, as well as a former Marco Island City Councilor, Charlette Roman has now turned her talents toward serving the State. In 2019 Governor Ron DeSantis appointed her to the Governing Board of the South Florida Water Management District and she was confirmed by the Florida Senate. Roman was reappointed in 2021.

In her seat on the Governing Board, she covers 10 counties and serves as Chair of the Big Cypress Basin Board, a separate taxing district covering all of Collier County and part of mainland Monroe County.

A dedicated Environmentalist, Charlette Roman is a certified Florida Master Naturalist. In recognition of her many years of educational and stewardship efforts, in 2009 she received the prestigious Collier County Audubon Society Fellowship.

In 2022, Roman was honored with the Laverne Norris Gaynor Environmental Champion Award by the Rookery Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve Board of Directors for her years of service in protecting the coastal environment.




