

An update from Rosalie Tornello, Director for Public Policy

AAUW Florida Lobby Days are March 17-19th. This is when AAUW members from Florida go to Tallahassee to lobby our representatives on issues important to the mission of AAUW. One area of greatest concern is The Gender pay gap that remains a glaring inequity. Woman working full-time year-round earned just 83% of what men earn. The gap is even wider when part-time and seasonal workers are included. The challenge grows even more complex for women of color, LGBTQ and those with disabilities. AAUW is continuing to work to ensure that all women bring home the pay that they rightfully earn.

Is It Time To Renew? A WORD or Two ABOUT MEMBERSHIP DUES

In the past, everyone's dues were due by June 30th (the end of the fiscal year). However, changes were made a couple of years ago so that is no longer true. The current process for new members is for the join date to be the renewal date. Also, if your renewal date was June 30th and you did not get your renewal in before the grace period ended and you renewed later, you now have a renewal date of the date you renewed. If you did pay when due, you still have June 30 as your renewal date.

What I am getting at is that your dues are due now depending on when you last paid. National now sends a reminder when your dues are due. You have the option to pay online or mail your check to our P.O. Box. In the past, we always started reminding members to pay their dues in February or March.

Please pay when you get the notification to make it easier for Lyn Maggio, the Director for Membership.

If you do not know when your dues are due, check online (or contact Lyn). It is really easy. You can also check your information to see if it is correct. Below is my information that I found online. Note the last line contains my renewal date.




